*Randy's Gray's Report*



April 2010

**T**he past several weeks have been exciting. The Bear Valley short course instructors, **Denny Petrillo** and **Keith Kasarjian**, have completed the courses they were teaching in the Chimala Bible College (CBC) and returned home to the USA. **Garry Hill** arrived with Denny and Keith on this trip. Garry will remain and teach a couple of quarters in the CBC. Garry has made the commitment to be a full time, on-site instructor for Bear Valley at the Chimala Mission location.

Let me tell you a little more about **Garry**. Garry has been preaching the Gospel of Jesus Christ since the day he graduated from Freed Hardeman University in 1978. He has filled pulpits in Kentucky and Georgia. His experience in mission work includes working in Latin America and in Scotland before joining Bear Valley.

His academic credentials include Masters Degree in History and Bible. At the present time, he is working on his PhD in Religious Studies. Garry is also an archaeologist at the Tell Beth Shemish excavations in the country of Israel. He has a television program on the Gospel Broadcasting Network on Bible History and Archaeology. He has also taken the assignment of tutoring CBC students in writing and doing research for their quarterly theme papers. With our current shortage of missionaries, Garry is going to have many opportunities to be very involved in evangelism in the local villages and speak at some of the Friendship Seminars held at different locations in southwest Tanzania. The Chimala family feels richly blessed to have Garry make this commitment. We appreciate so much his love for the work in East Africa.

My tour of duty in Chimala will end in a couple of weeks and I will arrive in the USA on the 21<sup>st</sup> of April.

**Bill** has been working extra hard since his return to Chimala. He is trying to make all the pieces fit back together, balance the books, and appraise decisions that were made in his absence. Please continue to pray for him during this transition time and while **Cindy** is still in the States. She plans to be back in Chimala before the end of April to prepare for summer guests.

God has heard their prayers and those of many others because their daughter's surgery went well. She has had a few setbacks but is beginning to heal and regain her strength. The past few months have been stressful and we are all thankful that she is doing well.

My lovely bride, **Jennifer**, has been keeping me informed about the severe winter that the USA has dealing with since early December. I arrived in Tanzania on December 2<sup>nd</sup> and missed one of the largest snow falls in Tarrant County history along with weeks of ice and the excitement of driving in that type of weather. East Africa is in its summer and rainy season. The temperature has ranged from the low 60's to the high 80's each day. Right now, the humidity is a constant presence, ranging from 100 % in the morning to 60 % as the day unfolds.

With my return to the States, I would love to visit with you, your family and friends, or make a presentation at your congregation about the work in Chimala. We are actively seeking new supporters and new missionaries, while remaining every grateful for our current supporters and missionaries. May God bless your efforts to serve Him.

Seems like there are always so many things that need to be done before you leave (and this is true whether you are going or coming) from gathering things that need to be packed, to saying your goodbyes to everyone, to getting all of your personal affairs in order and on and on the list goes. I am sure that there are things are that I have forgotten to do, but at least this time Cyndi is staying behind for a few weeks to help look after our daughter and daughter-in-law. Maybe she can tie up some of the loose ends that I forgot.**

It has seemed like that this year is going to be the year of surgeries for the Stinson family.

Three of my close family members have had to have surgery in the last two weeks. Fortunately it seems as everyone is doing ok. Angie probably has had the most problems. She is having some infection problems at one of the places they had to open her up and this is going to cause her to **have some delays in her healing. But, it looks like in the end that everyone will be better off after they recover.**

**During March Cyndi and I did a lot of traveling to many of the supporting congregations of the Chimala work. We traveled through 10 states during March and got to see some beautiful country and even better, many of our brothers and sisters in Christ. **W**e are excited about getting back and we know that there is a lot to be done when we get back. We are so appreciative of **Randy Gray** going and helping out while we were home. In the reports I have been receiving, it sounds like that things are going well over all at the mission. I just received some more reports this morning of some baptisms that were the results of evangelism works that are going on at several different areas around Chimala. We continue to have students at both the secondary school and primary school accepting the Truth and putting Christ on baptism. The evangelistic teams continue to go out 2-3 times a month and they are having good results.

Things at the hospital seem to be about the same. I know we have **two** things that we will be working on when I return.

1. Getting **More Doctors**
2. Opening **Nursing School**

Both of these things are items that will help our hospital. We continue to pray for help in these two areas.

Several projects need to be worked on as soon as I get back.

- One is getting the **well water** to the rest of the facilities at the mission. This will bring to completion a project that has been dreamed of for years at the mission.

- The **vehicles** used to transport our guest need to be ready for all of the road trips.
- The **Dining/Multipurpose** building needs be completed at the secondary school.
- Two more **classroom blocks** and a **Library** need to be built in the next year.
- We also need to build **more dorms** for the primary school.

Speaking of the summer guest; we have a busy summer this year scheduled, with several different groups coming to help at the mission. We always look forward to the visitors, knowing that more of God's will can be accomplished when we have extra help. Cyndi will arrive back the last week of April

I guess I should close this letter and get on the plane. A special thanks again for your continued support of the work.
