First Chimala Mission Group Visit For 2020

It has been nearly 2 weeks since Mary and I arrived at Chimala for our early-in-the-year 7-week visit. We felt very welcomed when we saw our good friends and brethren at the Chimala Mission. Also greeting us at the front gate was the stunning green colors of the mission nourished by the heavy seasonal rains typical of this time of year. Corn is growing well at the lower mission and a little slower higher

Arkansas. Gage and Kelly Coldwater with their children, Aurora and Pike arrived a few days later to resume efforts for the farm program. Mark and Gif's short visit was primarily made up of seeing all the operations and good works at the mission while also taking advantage of opportunities to teach and preach when offered.

Gif has visited Chimala before in Sept of

2018 when Dalraida was first considering taking the oversight. Mark who is a Dalraida deacon and mission committee member assigned the Chimala Mission as his area of service. While Mark and I have worked closely over the past year, he told me that he never realized how vast the mission really is. Photos never really paint the full picture that the work is due. It is not uncommon for people visiting for the first time to be astonished at the magnitude of this work. Mary and I have


CSOP News

As long as people are lost and untaught and as long as the church needs to grow and be edified, the Chimala School of Preaching will be a relevant effort of the Chimala Mission. This past November, there were 19 students who completed their assignments and received their diplomas. Most of the seventeen men will return to their homes and resume working with local churches. Some of them are local citizens. One of them has been hired by the Chimala Mission Hospital to serve as a chaplain. Two women will



return home equipped with a better knowledge of the Bible. This is more important than many people realize. In their culture, the children are often ignored in regards to a Bible education. And there is a woeful lack of attention paid to encouraging women to prepare themselves to teach Bible to the children. For that reason we are thrilled to have women in the CSOP program making for a more promising spiritual future for the young people in the church.

Like all preacher training and Bible schools, an adequate library is an important element in their success. As the Chimala School of Preaching works hard to train



preachers, teachers, and leaders in the church in Tanzania; we are always very happy to receive tools to help us carry

out this work. Before I left the States, Jared Jackson graciously donated copies of his father's, Wayne Jackson's, *New Testament Commentary*. This book will be a solid addition to the Lenkos Mkwama Library. Teddy, our librarian has already entered Jackson's book in the library database.

Although Swahili is the national language, English continues to be a sought-after language especially in advanced studies. Yet CSOP has plans to translate various books into Swahili. Already one of our instructors, Peter Kamatula has been granted permission to translate some books. We are working on getting computer equipment necessary for him to do this work. We are anticipating Exavery Ngullo to assist in this project also in the near future.

Whenever we have visiting preachers, we like to offer them an opportunity to speak to the students. This month John Ratliff and Tim Estes from Prescott, AR were offered opportunities to talk to our new 14 students. Boaz Kasiba's class on the preacher and his work was the perfect



platform for John and Tim to share their experiences in working with churches and in general ministry.

Farm Program Progress

The farm program of the Chimala Mission received a boost with the return of Gage and Kelly Coldwater with their children, Aurora and Pike. Already corn has been planted on the mission as well as at the Ailsa farm with beans to soon follow in February. As this is somewhat of an experimental year, we plan to plant larger tracts next growing season.

Other parts of the farm are also coming along well. When we arrived nearly two weeks ago, there were 89 pigs with a number of expecting sows. Just last night (1/20), one sow had 13 piglets, and she dropped another piglet even today putting us over 100 pigs! They are all healthy and causing us to expand their enclosures. Our ducks and goats are also doing well.

Finally, we have electricity connected to the mill for corn and rice. This will save the mission a large sum of money as we will no longer have to pay for milling. In addition, we will be able to provide milling services to the surrounding community. We can also receive payment in corn for milling making for a useful bartering system.
