The preparation stage to enter a mission field surely is different for each and every person. There are books, articles, and even YouTube videos demonstrating some of the fundamental steps when it comes to preparing oneself to begin serving in a foreign mission work.

Kristi and I have decided upon a January, 2021 departure timeline, which gives us roughly six months to finish fundraising as well as physically, mentally and spiritually

preparing ourselves. We have been using the past six months to prepare in a multitude of ways.

As it's been mentioned before, on our trip last summer Kristi saw a need in the hospital. Since committing to moving, vear she has desired to obtain some of medical sort education that she

could use to volunteer at the hospital on the mission. She has been taking classes in Memphis that initially were on-site, but later converted to an online format. She has passed everything to this point, but her final has been postponed due to the pandemic. Please pray she can finalize everything smoothly!

In addition to Kristi's training, we have fervently been gathering advice and information from our brothers and sisters in Christ, investing in multiple language learning programs and platforms, furthering our education in biblical knowledge, and even trying to "stay fit" (physical health is very important on a mission field!). We've also been getting rid of a lot of "junk" that we have accumulated. You might be surprised how much someone can gather over just a little over five years! Even so, with a few more months ahead of us, there is still plenty of travel, work, and prayers to be done.

While the COVID-19 pandemic has

definitely slowed down, it is important for us and many others not cling to discouragement anxiety it has brought, but rather continue to seek the silver lining. The chaos in the world that is brought about by sin can only hold onto us if we allow it. closes his letter to the Philippians with remarks about these types of

anxieties. When we have the peace that comes from God alone, it "...will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus" (Phil. 4:7). If you find yourself stuck on Facebook or social media becoming overly invested in political or social nonsense, here is a word of advice – take a break!

When preparing for anything, there will always be unknowns. Our daily prayer is that God will continue to be part of our preparation and deliver strength and determination for whatever lies before us.

Scheduled Evangelism Efforts

Without taking much of a break, CSOP staff and students continue to teach God's word to interested people in the many villages surrounding the greater Chimala area. As a starting place, they usually work around an existing congregation of the Lord's people. This not only gives them a place to return to for rest, a meal, etc., but it also confirms to the general public the stability of the church in their community. CSOP director, Frank Mwashikumbulu sent me a work schedule of the dates and locations in the months of June and July for their evangelistic efforts. They included areas around the following churches: Mlangali, Mlangali Stand, Luhovelo, Mbuyuni, Kimani, and Mfumbi. Below is Frank's most recent report:

Hello brethren we are greeting you in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord. Here in Tanzania we are going good. We are so thankful to God Who helped us to do His work at Mlangali A Church of Christ and Mlangali B Church Of Christ where we were with ten students and two teachers, Remy Mfaume and Frank Mwashikumbulu. The work which we did there are: we went house to house, supplying Bible lessons, tracts and Sunday worship. We succeeded to visit 32 houses which had 74 people. We supplied 166 Bible lessons and 800 tracts. Results for the work were two restorations, no baptisms, but four people promised us to be baptized and other people wanted more teachings. Attendance for Sunday worship was adults 56, children 24.

Your contributions to CSOP to train men to preach is always a practical means of helping us continue to keep the future growth of the Lord's church alive in Tanzania. Thank you for your continued support! Howell

Farm Harvest Report

As most of you know, the farm program was started to help the Chimala Mission toward the goal of becoming self-sufficient. This is a lofty goal, and it is easier said than done. But we are moving in that direction gradually with the increase in the size of land we are

farming and the number of livestock that's been added. And what is really encouraging is that a significant part of the increase is due individual contributors. A number of people have specifically requested that their funds be used for the farm program or to buy a cow, etc. To me, this is in a similar category as "sticks-andbricks" for



buildings, etc. While we wish all funds could be used for pure evangelism, the practical nature of mission work requires attending



to those things that make the work of the Lord's church in Tanzania possible. This has long been the approach the Chimala Mission has had to take due to the Tanzanian government's requirement for the churches to benefit the people. So while the very nature of foreign mission work requires that we expend a certain amount of energy and funds on the physical (cf. 1 Cor. 9:1-14; Rom. 15:25-28;

et. al), we do not lose our main focus of building up and expanding God's kingdom in Tanzania.

As of this writing, our farm manager—Ezekiel Mwambogolo reported that they are in the process of shelling corn and should have a total yield report very soon. They are also harvesting beans and will sift and measure for a report coming soon.
