

All unloading is done by hand without the assistance of a forklift, pallet jack, or any other device. These guys are incredible using teamwork, ingenuity, creativity and common sense to overcome whatever challenge faces them. Expensive items such as hospital equipment are often placed inside crates for protection during shipping.
