Howell Ferguson Friendship Seminar

Helping Christians remain faithful to the Lord is an ongoing challenge in any country. Satan never stops working to distract and weaken God's people. While there are three basic "avenues" of temptation (lust of the flesh, lust of the eyes, pride of life; 1 John 2:16), Tanzanians face a slightly different twist. **Frank Mwashikumbulu** reports on the following "Friendship Seminar":

Hello brethren, greetings to you all in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord. Here in Tanzania we are going good. We are so thankful to God who helped us to do the Seminar safely. We met with three Congregations as follows: Church of Christ Mapangala, Church of Christ Matebete and Church of Christ Kapunga. Lessons which we taught in the Seminar are three as followers: (1) Why we are needed to worship God: Teacher Frank Mwashikumbulu. (2) Standing in the truth: Teacher Boaz Kasiba. (3) Answering the questions from the Christians: All teachers. Most



questions asked by the women whose husbands are not Christians were: What are they to do while their husbands [try to stop] them from going to Church? We tried our best to answer the questions according to what the Bible says and gave them advice on how they can talk with their husbands. Attendance of the seminar: Adults 26, Children 22. All Christians they enjoyed much for the seminar and they asked us to have friendship seminar even twice per year.

A few weeks before we left Chimala, we were finally able to begin the first steps in constructing the new chicken house for the farm.

Ezekiel Harrison is our current farm manager, and his education and expertise in raising chickens gave us the perfect opportunity to implement a proper chicken program into the farm.


Our goal is to begin with layers - chickens we will use only for laying eggs. We will purchase them young, and after a few months of maturing, they will begin laying eggs daily. Eggs are extremely important to the community and will be an easy sell in the local markets.

Lord willing, we will get to a point where we can purchase more layers, and eventually start selling broilers (chickens for meat). As with everything with the farm, our goal is to have all of the funds put back into the mission, creating a self -sustaining operation that we can run wholly from within.

We had a total of 11 students graduate this year. The CSOP director, Frank Mwashikumbulu had a very powerful and moving speech as he introduced the students and led the celebratory ceremony. One powerful comment he made was about how the class originally started with many more students, but these were the ones who prevailed.

The program these students go through is not an easy program. It is not a "simple" study, but rather a formidable curriculum. This promotes the students to work very hard both in and out of the classroom, and the ones who finish and graduate are well prepared to stand firm and defend their faith.

With these students now returning home to their communities or new congregations, the task was set upon the administration of CSOP to recruit new students. This has been an ongoing process for several months, and there have been 21 students who applied and have been admitted into the program: 15 of these will go through the Swahili program, and 6 will enter the English program.

While both programs are very effective, the English program is where we have been pushing recruitment. It is common knowledge that the amount of English material at the mission is enormous, and so any student in the program will have a near limitless amount of resources available to them with our onsite library.

It has been a long dream to develop more Swahili materials, and we are slowly developing some resources with the assistance of native Swahili speakers. It is a big task, but one that will have tremendous value in the future.

The graduation was held on October 15th, and it was a



wonderful celebration with all of the students, their families, the faculty, and many local visitors invited to attend.

We pray for the CSOP program. We believe it is our most powerful tool in reaching the lost in Tanzania. We desire God's richest blessings on the program, the students, and everyone involved.
