## Can We Raise It By Ten?

In a previous newsletter this year, I mentioned an economic change occurring in Tanzania due to the government's decision to raise the country's minimum wage by ten percent. This will naturally be felt by Chimala Mission support as we fund the employment of the CSOP and the estate. Since we cannot ignore the government's demand to increase mission wages by citing separation of church and state (remember, Chimala is not in the United States), then we must comply.

In an effort to find a solution, I am asking for help from our current supporters. **Would you be willing to raise your current support by ten percent?** If we could raise just ten percent more from current supporters, we would be able to meet the new financial requirement for the mission's operation. And remember, this is not for the hospital or primary and secondary schools as they are primarily self-supporting. This is for the areas of the mission normally supported by churches and individuals.

As suggested, a ten percent increase in regular support would not put an unnecessary burden on any one church or person; and yet, it would resolve this deficit. That means that if a church donates \$300 per month, they would only have to increase their monthly amount by \$30 making a total of \$330. Depending upon the amount of monthly support, a ten percent increase would likely be negligible and yet would help Chimala in a huge way. Or you could decide to increase the amount by twenty or thirty percent, or more. And of course, this might be the right time for a church or person to decide to begin supporting Chimala Mission.

Having these kinds of financial demands at Chimala right in the middle of the year where we also have our Bible seminars and Gospel Chariot campaigns always puts a large strain on the mission budget. We work very hard to reduce or cut costs wherever we can without affecting the Tanzanians' salaries as they make so little; however, this is a permanent financial increase that will not go away. Will you help us climb and conquer this hill? As the Tanzanians depend upon us, we depend upon you. Help us keep this great mission "light" shining as it has done so well for nearly 60 years!

Dear Mission Supporter:

It is with a sad heart that I report I have returned to the United States. This decision was made after a month of breathing difficulties, sleepless nights and mood swings. I tried different solutions, but the difficulties remained. After much discussion with family, friends and, of course, time spent in prayer with God, I returned home Saturday July 9th. The quick date was chosen so that I could travel with some visitors who were also returning at that time. This allowed me to have some assistance with traveling.

This was not what I expected nor am I happy about it. However, I cannot give to others what I myself do not have. A question heavy on my heart is why I felt so strongly that I should return and yet, felt unable to continue. I hope each of you

can be understanding of this decision. We did help with many things while I was there. We helped with baby Promise and Brayan; provided some computers, new mattress covers, new floor for Female Ward, assisted with some cash flow for maintenance issues and I was able to assist in restarting some management plans including Hospital Management Team meetings, Quality Improvement Teams, etc. So some foundations were put in place for the new HMT and Director.

As of this time, I am requesting you stop support for my work fund, but would encourage you to continue sending support to the hospital if you can. The hospital is a very important part of the mission. There are 110 employees who depend on it for work, and thousands of patients in the area who need medical care which will not be as easy to access without this hospital and clinic. I do still have some funds which have been donated. I will be happy to return any funds which I received in June and those which come in July, unless you would like me to donate the funds to the hospital. Please let me know what you would prefer.

Please continue to pray for Chimala Mission and Hospital.
