Time to Donate Container Items is Now

The Chimala Mission is so thankful for everyone who cares for this great work demonstrated by your prayers, financial support, donations, working hands, visits, and in other ways. You would be surprised to know the effect you have on people whom you have never met. Without you, a void would be created that could not easily be replaced.

As I normally write this front page after completing the following pages, I am encouraged at the many opportunities afforded by the Chimala Mission to do so many good works. One of the current good works that I wish to emphasize now is helping us fill the container list on page three of this newsletter. Some of you have already contacted me about collecting supplies, but there is still much to do.

Our original idea was to send a container to Chimala in late March or early April in hopes of it being shipped, cleared and received at Chimala by mid-July before PTP (Polishing the Pulpit). One of the many reasons for wanting to move-on with this project was to get

another X-ray machine to the Chimala Mission Hospital as soon as possible.

Naturally, we know that we will not receive everything listed. For that reason, we will look over the list for items not received and decide what to purchase. This gives us the flexibility to prioritize what is loaded now or held back for a future shipment. If at all possible, we would like to finalize receiving donated items no later than the *end of April*.

But we move on. Prayer, perseverance, and patience are the three "P's" for success at Chimala. I wouldn't exactly say it's "no sweat!" But I would say we're making progress with the help of Nathan, Ezekiel, James and our farm workers. Thanks guys!

Updated Shipping Container List for Chimala

The October 2022 newsletter contained the original list of items needed at the Chimala Mission. That was five months ago. Since then, the list has been adjusted to more accurately describe what is needed. Below is the updated list of items:

• School supplies:

- Pens (black, blue, red), #2 pencils, erasers, pencil sharpeners
- ◆ School scissors (for younger & older), protractors, rulers, paper cutter, document tray organizer
- ♦ Spiral notebooks, Duo-Tang pocket folders, typing paper, file folders, 3-ring notebooks
- Encyclopedias, Webster's dictionaries
- Scotch tape rolls/dispensers, staplers & staples for teachers
- ◆ Crayons (24-ct boxes), white *dustless chalk* (Hagoromo or Crayola)
- Washable markers, colored pencils, dry-erase markers & erasers
- ♦ Liquid Paper, bottle glue, glue sticks
- Classroom clocks, basketballs, soccer balls, tennis equipment

CSOP:

- Pens, pencils, colored pencils, rulers, dry-erase boards & markers
- English Bibles, Bible maps, sleeping bags for student campaigns
- Printing/typing paper, spiral notebooks

Missionary supplies:

- ♦ Bar soap, soft-soap/refills, shampoo, toothpaste, deodorant
- Small appliances (toaster, mixer, coffee maker/grinder, etc.)
- ♦ Pillows, irons, ironing boards, wall clocks, kit knives, meat grinder
- Anti-itch cream, triple antibiotic ointment, anesthetic cream
- ♦ LED bulbs (110v screw type), acetone, bath & kitchen towels
- Long-lasting cookware (wood, stainless steel, cast iron, glass)
- ♦ Plastic food containers, foil, cling wrap, wax paper, zip-lock bags

Special requests:

- ◆ Used desktop or laptop computers (w/MS Office). A good way to get rid of unused working computers taking up closet space!
- Student microscopes, used X-ray machine (operational)
- ◆ Used medical/surgical tools—German made in good condition
- Hospital grade steel or plastic tables or cabinets
- Freezer for school kitchen, sewing machine, clothes dryers
- Heavy-duty gloves, rakes, extension ladders, wheelbarrows

There are more items needed that are not listed above that have technical specifications. These are mostly mechanical items and tools for the estate and farm. Rather than list all of these technical specs and risk receiving the wrong items; you may donate money so that these items can be bought locally, packaged and loaded. The total scholarship tuition needed for CMPS to continue the program for the 2023 school year is 13,200,000/- tsh (\$5,739); or \$522 average per student per year.

As many of you know, it has long been the policy that the Chimala preaching school program does not guarantee a job or salary to its graduates. Yet, educating their children is about the only way most families can lift themselves out of their meager income levels. For that reason, the Preachers' Kids Program is a wonderful benefit to these families. But with more preachers' kids enrolled this year, it is indeed a financial challenge. We want this program to continue and succeed because what these preachers do for little-to-no-pay is a great spiritual service to the churches of Christ in Tanzania. Can you help?
