Remembering God's Blessings

With the passing of Memorial Day, many people think of summer's beginning, even though summer officially begins June 21st. May we reflect upon Memorial Day as much more than another holiday cook-out. I can't think of a better way to reflect on this time of year than to remember the many blessings we've received from the Lord our God through the sacrifice of others. What God said to Israel, in principle, God says to us:



For the LORD your God is bringing you into a good land, a land of brooks of water, of fountains and springs, that flow out of valleys and hills; a land of wheat and barley, of vines and fig trees and pomegranates, a land of olive oil and honey; a land in which you will eat bread without scarcity, in which you will lack nothing; a land whose stones are iron and out of whose hills you can dig copper. Shipping Goods to Chimala

Many of you reading this newsletter have already donated either items or funds for items for this next shipping container. As of this writing, the loading date is officially Friday, the 16th of June. Most of the items needed have already been donated or bought, with the hopes of finalizing as much of the remaining things as possible.

Mary and I have been working nearly nonstop collecting and packing items, and updating the packing list and invoice. There are still some processing that has to be done with the goods remaining. The two big-ticket items, the X-ray machine and the refrigerated mortuary, have already arrived and are waiting with the other items at the warehouse in Montgomery. We are very grateful for the volunteer work of two of Dalraida's good men who built a shipping crate for the X-ray, as well as others who have assisted us in many ways.

We have another Oklahoma/Texas trip planned before loading. Coming back with us from that trip will be another load of donated goods. Those items combined with what we have already prepared and stored in Jackson will all then be brought back down to Montgomery to be added to the final packing list and invoice.

And that's where the real "fun" begins when the container finally reaches the port at Dar-es-Salaam. Unlike the old days, we seldom receive any tax exemptions as the port authority makes it an extremely complex and expensive exercise. In lieu of paying expensive port charges and penalties, we have found it cheaper in most cases just to pay the taxes.

Around The Mission

Even though the seasons are changing and the mission is slowing down, there are still a lot of things to update and report on. With regards to the farm, we have been moving forward each and every day. This is the time for us to check on all of our equipment, perform maintenance, and ensure everything is up to task for the future months ahead. Our disc plow needed some major repairs (as we originally bought it in used condition). A new shaft needed to be put in and new bearings on the discs themselves. We are now ready to go! Since we are starting the dry season, we must also be preparing for the great task of building our firebreaks both on the mission property and at the Ailsa farm. As I've written several times before, this is a vital "ritual" of the mission here. With this much wooded property it would not take much to lose it all. James chapter 3 gives us a pretty real example of what can happen!

The other departments are continuing in their respective areas. The Chimala School of Preaching still is out of session until the students return in July. On the other hand, we have our seminars starting just next week; you can see everyone is rushing around getting everything ready for all of our visitors. This is such an exciting time on the mission, and I look forward to updating you all on the successes after this month.

Both the primary school and secondary school have just let out the kids for their winter break. This means the schoolgrounds will be a little more quiet and gives us a reason to await their return. However, there will still be a few classes that remain. National exams are a huge part of the school system here, so some of those students will remain in preparation for them.

The hospital continues to move along in its day-to-day activities. Our hospital administrator has been doing a great job working through a lot of our previous issues from years past - we can now see a lot of visible progress from his successes. We are still tending to dozens of patients every single day, delivering babies, and reaching out to those who need to hear the gospel. Please continue to pray for all of our hard-workers in the hospital.

Finally, all of the other workers around the estate continue to ensure the well-being of the property. It's easy to take for granted all of the guards, yardmen, plumbers, electricians and mechanics that keep this well-oiled machine running every day. Let us always be thankful and grateful for God's providential care for the Chimala Mission.
