We offer praise and thanksgiving to our Great God to Whom we have received so many good things. God has bestowed upon each of us another year of life and a host of new opportunities. While TODAY is the only day God has promised us, the completion of 2023 demonstrates God's patience, longsuffering, and a desire that all people everywhere come to a knowledge of His truth and call upon the name of the Lord in faithful gospel obedience.

January is an exciting time at Chimala. The rains have returned, everything is turning green, and the frenzy of the planting season is evident as farmers are in the fiends planting corn, rice, beans and a host of other crops. On the mission grounds, everything is alive with the returning of younger students at the Chimala Mission Primary School; and the older students at the Herring Christian Secondary School. Accompanying the students are their parents helping their children to get moved and settled-in to their dorms. New students are also arriving to begin a new year at the Chimala School of Preaching.

Mary and I along with Randy Rice (see page 2) are truly looking forward to the mission Saturday afternoon, Jan. 13th. Among other visitors arriving at the same time in January will be **Mark and Edith Givens** from the Arlington, TX area. They will have spent part of their time in Arusha and the remainder of their time at Chimala. We pray for their safe travels as well.

Besides the warm fellowship of being back with our brothers and sisters at the mission; we are also anticipating to see some much-needed things coming to fruition. First of all, we are so happy that a new infant warmer has finally been purchased and delivered at the Chimala Mission Hospital. This is such a huge blessing to the hospital where so often newborns (especially preemies) were having great difficulty staying warm in spite of the hospital's best efforts. We're certainly thankful to those of you who reached out to us wanting to help to alleviate this dangerous obstacle to the heath of our newborns.

Another great blessing the mission has finally received is the repair part for the "hydram" (hydraulic ram) that not only supplies the mission with general purpose water, but is also the primary source of water for the hospital's water purification system. Mary and I are personally proud of Nathan who basically navigated the entire process from researching and finding the sole supplier in Great Britain to getting the part cleared and transported to Chimala. From the last images and videos I saw, the hydram was pumping-away while the large water reservoir was literally overflowing with water. I can't wait to see it. Thanks to all of you who made all these wonderful events happen!

Beginning Classes at CSOP

It has been nearly six months since our last visit to Chimala Mission. We're always excited to return to be with our Tanzanian brothers and sisters as they continue to serve the Lord in that part of East Africa. I always like to emphasize that this is "their work". It is true, that we are co-workers with them, and are willing to share with them the resources that we, by God's grace, have been given stewardship over. But the Tanzanians are letting their own light shine by their hands on approach to accomplishing God's will.

One of these areas of the Tanzanians' works is the Chimala School of Preaching. January 15th will mark the first day of class for the new intake of students at CSOP. They come from all over Tanzania to begin their two-year study program of the Bible and Bible-related classes. The philosophy of this approach to preacher-training is nothing new to the Lord's church.

Around the world, brethren realize the wisdom of teaching people the Bible in their own country, in their own culture, by their own people. Not only does this make it possible to teach many more people at once; but it also saves the Lord's church a ton of money that otherwise would be spent bringing foreign nationals into the United States. This is especially true today with the "open-border" crisis that has resulted in over 10 million illegals into our country in the past few years.

Furthermore, it is much more practical and far less expensive to occasionally invite biblically sound, experienced and educated short-course teachers from the States with unique talents and background to compliment the indigenous Chimala instructors.

One of those individuals that we have invited to teach at the Chimala School of Preaching is **Randy Rice**. Randy and his good wife, Kathy worship with us at the North Jackson church of Christ in Jackson, Tennessee. Randy recently retired from working at Fed-Ex, and is excited about visiting Tanzania for his first time and teaching a short course on a "Survey of the Bible". Randy received his Bachelor's degree in Bible and Missions in 1982 from Oklahoma Christian University. He received the Master's in Counseling in 1987 from Harding Graduate School of Religion. Before moving to Jackson, Randy preached for 25 years near Evansville, Indiana.

The total scholarship tuition needed for CMPS to continue the program for the 2024 school year is 13,200,000/- tsh (\$5,739); or \$522 average per student per year.

The most noticeable and natural difference between these children and those enrolled in the preachers' program last year is: the absence of two of the children, the addition of two new children, and the grade advance of all the children. These changes speak to the program's positive effect as some children graduated and moved-on to the secondary level school, new preachers' children were added, and all of the children passed their requirements to transition to the next grade. The success of this program gives us great joy to know that the children of these preachers who work and sacrifice so much for the gospel's sake are receiving a Christian education. *Can you help?*
