Collections on Hold

Several months back in 2023, we shipped and unloaded a 40-foot container with items collected and purchased since the previous container well over two years ago. I don't need to reiterate all of the goods that the Chimala Mission received. However, what is becoming rapidly apparent is the incredible costs to ship these containers. The last three containers cost \$30,000, \$20,000, and \$23,000 respectively. That first container was a near disaster. But truthfully, there is very little control we have over the total costs to ship containers. And that doesn't even include the costs for the items themselves nor the reimbursement for in-country mileage.

I am mentioning these things simply to underscore the reality of what may be the coming end of shipping items to Chimala on a regular basis. This has been a struggle hard to come to grips with for a number of reasons. Firstly, I know there are many Christians who have conscientiously labored with their own hands to make or collect specific items for the mission's different departments. Who can put a price on that? Secondly, with what we spend on shipping and clearing these containers alone, we could purchase a major percentage of items that are now available in Tanzania and have money to spare. And thirdly, the Tanzanian people are so grateful who receive these gifts of love from giving hearts of Christian people back in the States. Yet we may not be able to continue sending these types of precious gifts.

Naturally, we never want to stop demonstrating Christian charity. But we simply have to find more efficient and smarter ways of continuing this blessed tradition. I have some alternative ways and ideas that I hope to share in a future newsletter. But for now, I would like to kindly ask those of you who make or donate items to please put these good efforts on pause. I will continue to visit supporting churches to provide update reports. But I will not be receiving donated goods at least for now until the leadership makes a final decision or we announce a new way to continue a timeless and priceless tradition but in a more effective manner.

Helping Where Possible

While there are many blessings received by the Chimala Mission, there are still many areas that we struggle to overcome. For example, a visit to the Chimala Mission Primary School brings to mind a pressing problem resulting from the low wet area very close to the Chimala River where the school is located. Makeshift bridges using stones and wood slabs are made to give access to pathways during the rainy season. While functional, these are not only unsafe but also unsanitary for the kids as the septic systems are simply unable to "perk" properly, exposing waste water to the surface rain water. While we can't literally move the school to a dryer location, we can improve the situation by diverting the natural water flow with proper drainage, raising walkways, and installing culverts in key areas. It is an annual problem which peaks especially in the rainy season.

This brings me to a real concern: keeping the schools attractive to parents who want their children to have a Christian-based education in a safe and sanitary environment. Such a goal does not happen by

accident. It takes intentional planning and funding.

Both the Chimala Mission Primary School and the Herring Christian

Secondary Schools are self-supporting programs. And while we do not send monthly support to these schools as we do for the Chimala School of Preaching and the mission estate; the initial construction of these schools, however, was funded by American support. Please understand, the schools are able to do small projects. But in reality, at least for now, any significant repairs, improvements, or additions are simply beyond their means.

The leadership of the Chimala Mission realizes that it would take a sizable sum of money to upgrade the mission to the standards most Americans would accept as normal. But Chimala is in Tanzania where life is different and, as a general truth, more difficult. So while the kind of assistance the schools are hoping for may not necessarily be feasible, anything to move the conditions in the right direction would receive a positive and grateful reception.
